#### **BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE**

The Red Shirt Band was organized by George E. (Doc) Hurt in the spring of 1928. The members consisted of both Edinburg College and Edinburg High School students. During 1928-1931 the band won many trophies and awards at contests throughout Texas. The band performed in many Rio Grande Valley towns in order to raise money to attend the contests.

Arnold Melvin Kay was a member of the original band who played trumpet until his graduation. He compiled the scrapbook in the collection.

#### SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

In addition to a scrapbook kept by Arnold Melvin Kay during the first years of the Red Shirt Band, the collection includes nine loose photographs, several newspaper clippings, a copy of the May 15, 1931 issue of *The Wrangler*, a short history of the band written by Steven M. Heacock, and notes about the biography of George E. Hurt.

#### **SERIES DESCRIPTIONS**

#### I. Scrapbook, 1928-1931, 1965

The scrapbook contains a studio photograph of George E. Hurt, news articles about the cups and honors won by the band, and news articles about performances in other Texas cities. Newspaper photographs that are duplicates of some of the photographs in the Loose Photographs Series are found in the scrapbook with the names of individuals in the photograph included in the caption. Other items include a telegram, memorabilia, and programs for the Red Shirt Band performances as well as various other groups of performers. The scrapbook has 12 photographs that are undated and unidentified. The pages in the last third of the book are unused. Both the front and back covers are missing.

Pages 16-17 of the booklet tell about the Red Shirt Bands and list the many awards that it won. Other items are news clippings that describe the fiftieth anniversary celebration that took place in 1965.

#### IV. Miscellaneous, 1965, 1976, 1978, undated

This series includes a letter, a typed history of the band, typed biographical notes for George E. Hurt, and a 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary program. The August 26, 1976 letter was written by Mr. Kay (Tucson, Arizona) to Jack and Steve. The band is not mentioned in the letter.

The history of the band was written by Steven M. Heacock who was a clarinetist in the original Red Shirt Band.

It is unclear who typed the biographical notes for George E. Hurt. That person talked with Hurt's widow on February 2, 1978 in Austin, Texas. The notes describe why Hurt moved to the United States from the United Kingdom and how he came to Edinburg to head the music department in Edinburg, Texas.
