BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Violet Marcelle Robison was born on October 30, 1920 in Arkansas. She traveled with her family on the train to Texas in the spring of 1923 and lived in Weslaco with them until the summer of 1926. The family moved to Mission, Texas, for about 10 months in 1926. Robison attended Primary School (Kindergarten) there, and her teacher was Julia Norton. Robison received a vaccination on the leg so the mark wouldn't show. In 1937 Robison graduated from McAllen High School.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

A card certifying that Marcelle Robison was vaccinated comprises the collection. The type of vaccine is not recorded, however, the vaccination was declared successful. The certification is dated October 4, 1926, and Robison was five years old when she was vaccinated.
