SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

A chart of instructions for the application of the High-Frequency Current for medical conditions comprises the collection. Included on the chart is a list of diseases, directions for using the apparatus for each, current, electrode number, number of minutes for treatment, interval layers, and method.

The artifacts in the collection consist of a black case that includes a High-Frequency Current Apparatus. It comes with a black plastic handle for the machine, three glass applicators, and a plug. The apparatus was manufactured by Beadon-Dun Company of Chicago.
