BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

In 1987 Robert Gandy was the Executive Vice President of the First National Bank in Edinburg, Texas. He collected materials pertaining to two special ceremonies honoring two people from Edinburg. The people being honored were Texas State Senator James "Jim" Storey Bates, Sr. and Sergeant Alfredo Cantu "Freddy" Gonzalez.

Bates was born in 1923 and died in 1989. He was two when his family moved to the Rio Grande Valley in 1925. He attended Mission High School and Edinburg Junior College and received his law degree from the University of Texas. He served as district attorney for Hidalgo County in the 1950s, Texas state representative from 1955 to 1961, and Texas state senator from 1967 to 1969.

During Bates's tenure as senator, he was elected president pro tempore by the Texas State Senate and was Governor for a Day on June 29, 1968. The president pro tempore is considered the second most powerful position in the Texas State Senate. The person holding that position is usually the most senior member of the Senate and presides when the Lieutenant Governor is not present or when the legislature is not in regular session. It has been a Texas tradition since the early 1960s to honor the president pro tempore by declaring him or her Governor for a Day.

González was born on May 23, 1946, in Edinburg, Texas. His parents were Andrés Cantu and Dolia González. He enlisted in the Marine Corps Reserve in San Antonio, Texas, on June 3, 1965 and served two tours of duty in Vietnam. On February 4, 1968, González was mortally wounded in Hue City while holding back an enemy advance and destroying an enemy rocket position. The U.S. Congress posthumously awarded the Medal of Honor to González on October 31, 1969. The *USS Alfredo González* (DDG 66), an Arleigh Burke Class guided missile destroyer, was named in his honor and launched on February 18, 1995.
