BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Little Bear Brand, by J&D Produce of Edinburg, Texas, was founded in the early 1980's by Jimmy and Diane Basetti. The Little Bear Brand crate label is reserved for sweet vegetables, though J&D Produce also sold fruits. J&D Produce first filed for trademark of the Little Bear Brand Name in 1994. Progresso Brand, of national fame, from Uddo & Taormina Company started canning beans in the World War II era. More information can be found at their website. http://www.progresso.com/Home/Our-Story

SweeTex, Sweetmex, and Rogers Brand were shipped by both the Crutchfield Brothers and Chas A. Rogers & Sons. The SweeTex brand produced a variety of citrus fruits, peaches, cantaloupes, and vegetables. Chas A. Rogers & Sons filed for the SweeTex trademark in December of 1930. Many of the Rogers Brand items held the slogan "World's Sweetest."

Texas Don of Donna Fruit Company Inc, is located in Edinburg, Texas. The Texas Don brand name was first trademarked December 31, 1946. The crate label included in the folder promotes their grapefruits and oranges. The company does not currently maintain a website.

Tex Rio Tomatoes by the Interstate Fruit & Vegetable Company was based out of La Feria, Texas.

Texsun Corporation out of Weslaco, Texas has a Texas State Historical Marker in its honor. The plaque reads: "The citrus industry was an integral part of the Rio Grande Valley economy in the 20th century. Grove development burgeoned in the 1920s and 1930s, but production outpaced early marketing capabilities; in 1932, 17 citrus associations formed the Rio Grande Valley Citrus Exchange. The exchange began production under the labels of TexSun and Tex Maid, and later had a box company, juicing and canning facilities, and a dehydration plant for citrus pulp-based cattle feed. It became a public corporation in 1956 and a subsidiary company in 1971. The plant ceased operations in 1991, but its economic impact on the Texas citrus industry, The Valley and Weslaco was significant."
