BIOGRAPHICAL/HISTORICAL NOTE

Thomas Robert (Bob) Vaucher was born in Mission, Texas on December 3, 1918. He attended Citizens Military Training Camp at Camp Bullis near San Antonio, Texas in 1935. Four years later he earned his civilian pilot license and enlisted in the Army Air Corps. A decorated veteran, he served in the Panama, China-Burma-India, and Central Pacific Theaters. When he was discharged from active duty in June 1946, he had attained the rank of lieutenant colonel.

Vaucher married Eleanor Hooey, and they had three children. In his civilian life, he worked in the metal working industry. In 2013 he was inducted into the New Jersey Aviation Hall of Fame. Today Vaucher lives in Bridgewater, New Jersey and is a speaker on World War II aviation.
